Guest Speaker - Princess Kasune Zulu



Our speaker in 2011 will be Princess Kasune Zulu, one of Africa's most prominent activists in combating AIDS. Both of Princess Zulu's parents and two of her siblings were felled by the deadly pandemic and she herself has tested positive for the human immunodeficiency virus, or HIV, the predictor for AIDS.

"I'm already infected and there's nothing I can do about that, but I know I can still do something," she explained.

Princess Zulu has met with a host of international leaders to lobby for action on HIV/AIDS, including President George Bush in 2003. She is a spokesperson for the Hope Initiative, an AIDS-prevention project run by World Vision and was a key note speaker in the "Women and AIDS" tour sponsored by the United Nations. In addition to her international advocacy, Zulu initiated and administers a school for orphans of HIV/AIDS in Africa and regularly speaks on Zambian radio to promote awareness. She has co-authored a book, "Warrior Princess: Fighting for life with courage and hope" about her experiences.

International Women's Day 2011 Project

The proceeds raised from UN Women Australia's fundraising efforts in 2011 will go towards UN Women projects that promote female political participation and leadership.

In our neighbouring Pacific Islands, less than 13% of politicians are women, which is one of the lowest rates of representation in the world. Globally, that figure stands at 19.1% meaning that women comprise less than a fifth of parliamentarians.

UN Women, among many other initiatives, works to train women to run for parliament, providing them with the technical and financial assistance necessary to overcome the barriers to female leadership and seek office. Promoting women in leadership promotes the representation of concerns of women and female role models for the next generation.

About UN Women

UN Women (formerly UNIFEM) is the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women. The agency came into operation on January 1st 2011 as a part of the UN reform agenda, merging the four pre-existing gender agencies within the UN system to improve the United Nation's capacity to empower women in the developing world. UN Women works to enhance women's economic security and rights, end violence against women and promote women's leadership in governance and post-conflict reconstruction.

The Australian National Committee for UN Women supports UN Women's work by raising public awareness about gender and development issues, engaging the support of governments and raising funds for selected UN Women projects.
